

I. PREAMBLE

Whereas it is expedient to devise a comprehensive admission policy for admissions to the Intermediate and Undergraduate programmes at Islamia College Peshawar; and to remove complexities and inconsistencies in the whole procedure pertaining to admissions; and to ensure maximum transparency in the assessment and allocation of quota(s) and seat(s) for admissions at Islamia College Peshawar, the following set of regulations are hereby formulated.

II. TITLE AND COMMENCEMENT

These regulations shall be called “Islamia College Peshawar Admissions Regulations for Intermediate and Undergraduate Programmes 2023”.

These regulations shall come into force at once, and shall replace and supercede all Admissions Regulations previously in vogue in ICP. However if there are any areas related to Admissions in ICP which are not covered under the subject Regulations; in such cases, the previously followed Regulations shall stand valid provided that they are not in contradiction with the subject Regulations in any way whatsoever.

III. APPLICABILITY

These regulations shall be called “Islamia College Peshawar Admission Regulations for Intermediate and Undergraduate Programmes 2023”. These regulations shall replace regulations **pertaining to Admissions including Section-4.1**, Admission and Registration of the “Islamia College Peshawar Admission, Registration & Examination Regulations for BS & Equivalent Programme 2019”. All admission prospectuses and brochures for intermediate and undergraduate programmes shall be according to these regulations. These regulations shall also apply to the constituent/affiliated colleges and institutions.

IV. TERMS & ABBREVIATIONS

In these Regulations, unless there is anything contradictory to the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Universities Act 2012 (amended in 2016) and the Islamia College Peshawar Statutes 2016, the following expressions shall have the meanings as mentioned below:

- a) ICP/ University/ College means Islamia College, Peshawar.
- b) Department/Center means Teaching Department of the Islamia College, Peshawar.
- c) Subsidized Fee or Rate means fee for open merit seats.

- d) Normal Fee or Rate means fee for self-finance or self-support seats.
- e) College authority means The Vice Chancellor of Islamia College, Peshawar.
- f) Discipline means Science, General Science/Computer Science, Arts and Dars-e-Nizami/Islamic Theology.
- g) Category means Normal or Subsidized fee.
- h) SSC means Secondary School Certificate.
- i) HSSC means Higher Secondary School Certificate.
- j) BISE means Board of Intermediate and Secondary Education.
- k) CNIC means Computerized National Identity Card.
- l) Alumni means any person who remained a full time student of ICP and its constituent schools and colleges, and obtained a degree or certificate, where certificate means SSC or HSSC.
- m) **Employee means a regular employee of ICP.**
All other expressions not specifically defined here shall carry the same meanings assigned to them in the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Universities Act 2012 (amended in 2016) and the Islamia College Peshawar Statutes 2016.
- n) Sister University means a university which ICP has a memorandum of understanding (MoU) of admissions with.

Section 1

GENERAL REGULATIONS

- 1.1 Admissions shall be offered through advertisement published in a minimum of two newspapers. Moreover, the advertisement shall also be published on the official website and social media pages and platforms.
- 1.2 Admissions shall be carried out through the online admission portal. Admission forms along with information brochures shall be available on payment from banks on the campus during working hours in case admissions are conducted offline.
- 1.3 The admission processing fee shall be determined by the Central Admission Committee from time to time.
- 1.4 Applications for admissions that are incomplete and/or submitted after the last date shall not be entertained.
- 1.5 Admissions on quota seats shall be granted on the merit determined among the applicants for the respective quota.

- 1.6 Admission shall be liable to cancellation at any stage if the documents submitted by a candidate are found fake, forged, or tampered with. ICP shall report such a case to the police or other law-enforcement agencies.
- 1.7 Admitted/enrolled Intermediate students who have passed their SSC from a BISE other than BISE Peshawar shall furnish migration certificate within two weeks of the admission.
- 1.8 All admitted/enrolled undergraduate students shall furnish migration certificate within two weeks of the admission. Fine will be charged in case of late submission.
- 1.9 A revised DMC shall only be accepted if produced by the date of interview. A revised DMC produced after the date of interview shall not be accepted in any case.
- 1.10 A candidate shall clearly specify the category/ discipline/ programmeme/ quota against which they are applying.
- 1.11 Before displaying the final merit list, a provisional merit list shall be displayed to address the candidates' grievances, if any. In case of genuine grievances, the candidate shall submit an application to the Director Admissions within two working days. The Director Admissions shall address such grievances and shall inform the candidate concerned within two working days.
- 1.12 In case of more than one candidate having the same marks for a seat, the available seat shall be filled on the basis of seniority of age.
- 1.13 The complete data (names, marks, percentage, roll number, date of birth, institution last attended and the year in which last examination was passed) of the provisionally admitted students shall be submitted to the Registrar, Controller of Examinations, Treasurer, Coordinator Inter Studies, Principal ICG and other relevant sections of the University.

Section 2

COMMITTEES

The following committees shall be constituted to ensure the smooth-sailing of the admissions procedure at various levels.

2.1 Central Admission Committee

2.1.1 **Composition:** The Central Admission Committee shall consist of the following members. The Vice Chancellor shall nominate the members of the committee.

2.1.2 Functions: The Central Admission Committee shall have the powers/functions to

- i. oversee the overall admission process
- ii. decide the advertisement and schedule of admissions
- iii. determine the admission processing fee for various programmes
- iv. re-appropriate the seats in case any of them remain vacant
- v. approve the distribution/allocation of seats in hostels
- vi. interpret/clarify/explain ambiguity in these rules, if any. The decision of the committee shall be final. However, this decision(s) shall be reported to the Academic Council for further deliberations and future reference.

2.2 CENTRAL APPELLATE COMMITTEE

2.2.1 Composition: The Central Appellate Committee shall consist of the following members.

The Vice Chancellor shall nominate the members of the committee.

- Vice-Chancellor or nominee Convener
- Two deans or professors (other than the dean or professor in the central admission committee) Member
- Director Admissions Secretary

2.2.2 Functions: The Central Appellate Committee shall address the grievances/appeals of the candidate regarding the admission process.

2.3 DEPARTMENTAL ADMISSION COMMITTEE

2.3.1 Composition: The Departmental Admission Committee shall consist of the following members. The Chairperson/Head of the department concerned shall nominate the members of the committee.

- i. Chairperson/Head of the department Convener
- ii. Three teachers of the department preferably the senior-most; one of whom shall act as member-cum-secretary. Members

2.3.2 Functions: The Departmental Admission Committee shall have the powers/functions to determine

- i. the number of seats in each programme in consultation with the Director Admissions

- ii. the suitability of candidates by scrutinizing their documents, registration forms and fee deposit slips
- iii. the number of vacant seats for admission in 3rd and 5th semester which number shall be sent to the Director Admission for advertisement
- iv. The eligibility of the candidates seeking admission in 3rd and 5th semester in consultation with the Controller of Examinations or his nominee.

2.4 INTERMEDIATE ADMISSION COMMITTEES

- 2.4.1 The Director Admission shall constitute committees for conducting interviews of candidates seeking admission in Intermediate.
- 2.4.2 Each committee shall consist of three members from the teaching community. The senior-most among them shall act as convener of the committee.
- 2.4.3 The members of the committees shall be trained for the admission process by the Directorate of Admissions.

2.5 SPORTS TRIALS COMMITTEES

- 2.5.1 **Composition:** The Sports Trial Committees shall consist of the following members. The Vice Chancellor shall nominate the members of the committee on the recommendation of the Director Admissions.
 - i. Professor or Associate Professor Convener
 - ii. Director Admission or his nominee Member
 - iii. Two Experts from the relevant Sports (Nominated by the VC from the List of Experts) Members
 - iv. Director Sports/Nominee Member/Secretary
- 2.5.2 The quorum of the committee shall be four. However, the presence of members at Serial number i and iii shall be compulsory.
- 2.5.3 The convener shall have a non-transferable casting vote in case of a tie.
- 2.5.4 The Director Sports shall provide a list of experts, not less than three for each game. The list of experts shall be duly approved by the Vice Chancellor.
- 2.5.5 The decision of the simple majority of the members of the Committee shall be final.
- 2.5.6 Admission shall be granted to the short-listed candidates in sports trials as per their own choice of discipline.

- 2.5.7 Provisional admission of the shortlisted candidates duly signed by the Committee members upon the completion of each trial shall be notified and displayed on the notice board and official website.
- 2.5.8 The waiting list shall also be prepared and signed by the Committee members in the respective game along with the provisional merit list.

2.6 DIFFERENTLY ABLED (DISABLED) COMMITTEE

2.6.1 Composition:

The Committee for the Admissions of the Differently Abled (Disabled) candidates shall consist of the following members. The Vice Chancellor shall nominate the convener of the committee.

The presence of the members at serial No i and ii is mandatory for making any decision.

2.6.2 Functions:

The committee shall scrutinize and grade the candidates seeking admission on the seats reserved for the differently abled candidates under the following grading system.

- i. Fifty percent weightage shall be given to academic marks whereas fifty percent weightage to the disability marks.
- ii. The disability shall be classified into the following three categories:
 - a. **Severe disability:** all limbs are disabled/ not functioning.
 - b. **Major Disability:** two or three limbs are disabled. Cases with total blindness or those who are totally deaf and dumb are also included in this category.
 - c. **Minor Disability:** One limb is disabled or total loss of vision in one eye or there is total deafness in one ear or the candidate is dumb. Rheumatoid Arthritis, Retinitis Pigmentosa of one eye are examples of minor disability, or as the Committee may identify and decide.
 - d. Marking range for these categories shall be as follows:
 - Minor disability marks** = 1 to 17
 - Major disability marks** = 18 to 34
 - Severe disability marks** = 35 to 50

2.6.2 **Eligibility:** The candidate shall EITHER have a certificate from the Department of Social Welfare and Women Development, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (KP) or equivalent if the candidate does not belong to KP OR a disabled CNIC/ Form-B from the National Database and Registration Authority (NADRA).

2.6.4 Seats Allocation: Nine (9) seats shall be allocated at Intermediate level with the following breakup:

2.7 COMMITTEE for HAFIZ-E-QURAN TEST

2.7.1 Composition: On the recommendation of the Director Admissions in consultation with the Chairperson, Department of Islamic Theology, the Vice Chancellor shall constitute committees comprising the following for hafiz-e-Quran test.

- (i) One Professor/Associate Professor Convener
- (ii) Two Huffaz-e-Quran (Preferably Teachers) from the panel approved by the Vice Chancellor on the recommendation of the Director Admissions in consultation with Chairman, Department of Islamic Theology Member
- (iii) Nominee of the Director admission (not less than BPS-18) Secretary

Quorum: The presence of all the members of the committee is mandatory for making a decision.

2.7.2 Functions: The committee shall declare a candidate hafiz-e- Quran or otherwise as per the following procedure:

- i. Five questions shall be asked from each candidate with at least one question by each member. The questions shall be from the whole Quran and not a specific *para*.
- ii. A candidate shall be declared as Hafiz-e-Quran if they answer four (4) questions correctly.

Section 3: REGULATIONS FOR ADMISSION AT INTERMEDIATE LEVEL

Annual Admissions at the Intermediate level shall be offered within three days of the declaration of results by the Board of Intermediate and Secondary Education Peshawar or as necessitated by the circumstances mentioned in Section 3.1(ii) after approval by the Vice Chancellor in consultation with Central Admission Committee. Admissions shall be open to all the eligible candidates from all over the country.

3.1 ADMISSIONS REGULATIONS

- i. Admissions shall be granted strictly on merit determined on the basis of marks obtained in SSC or equivalent from a recognized board.

- ii. However, in special circumstances admission shall be granted on the basis of class 9th result after approval of the Vice Chancellor ICP. Merit in such cases shall be determined on the marks obtained in class 9th. The candidate, however, shall produce result of 10th class within two weeks of the declaration of results by the BISE concerned. Moreover, the candidate is required to clear the 10th class exam with the basic criteria as mentioned in Section 3.4(iii).
- iii. Admissions shall normally be offered in the 1st year of the Intermediate level. However vacant seats shall be filled through advertisement.
- iii. Migration to Islamia College, Peshawar at the intermediate level shall not be allowed.
- iv. Each section/class in a discipline at Intermediate level shall comprise at least 20 students. If the number of admitted students in a class/section of a discipline is less than 20 students, admissions in the discipline shall be withdrawn.
- v. Each subject shall have at least 10 students. If less than ten (10) candidates opt for a subject, that subject shall not be offered at all and the candidates concerned shall have to opt for another optional subject.
- vi. Change of subject or discipline shall not be allowed after the completion of the admission process.
- vii. Transfer from the normal fee (Self-Finance) to the subsidized (Open) fee shall not be allowed after the closing/completion of the admission process.
- viii. The maximum age for admission is 19 years, relax-able up to a maximum of 3 years by the Principal, Islamia College for girls and Principal ICP for boys. The age shall be determined from the closing date of the submission of admission forms.
- ix. No admission shall be processed unless granted by the respective admission committee(s).
- x. Admissions granted by the admission committee(s) shall remain provisional and shall not create any legal entitlement until completion of the registration with BISE Peshawar.
- xi. Re-instatement fee of Rs.2000/- shall be charged.

3.2 Courses of Studies at Intermediate level: A candidate may opt for one of the following disciplines:

Discipline-I: SCIENCE:

Pre-Medical: Biology, Physics, Chemistry

Pre-Engineering: Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry

Discipline-II: GENERAL/COMPUTER SCIENCE

Group 1 (General Science/Computer Science-I): Computer Science, Mathematics and Physics

Group 2 (General Science/Computer Science-II): Computer Science, Mathematics and Statistics
Group 3 (General Science/Computer Science-III): Computer Science, Statistics and
Mathematics

Discipline-III: ARTS: In this discipline, a student may opt for three subjects from the following:

Arabic, Archaeology, Civics, English Literature, Geography, Islamic History, Islamic Studies, Library Science, Pashto, Psychology, Sociology

Non-Muslim students can opt for Civics instead of Islamic Education.

Discipline-IV: DARSE NIZAMI/ISLAMIC THEOLOGY: The students shall study the following compulsory subjects.

AL-Quran with Tafseer, AL-Hadith with Usool-e- Hadith, AL-Fiqah with Usool-e-Fiqah
AL-Adab-Al-Arabi and AL-Qawaid-Wal-Insha

One subject from the following list.

Arabic, Archaeology, Civics, English Literature, Geography, Islamic/Muslim History, Islamic Studies, Library Science, Pashto, Psychology, Sociology

ADMISSIONS PROCEDURE

- i. A candidate seeking admission in the first year shall submit their registration form along with a copy of their DMC and original deposit slip or proof of payment of the admission application fee at the time of the interview.
- ii. A candidate shall also submit their two passport-size photographs with white background, a copy of their father's/guardian's CNIC, Provisional and Character Certificates and Domicile certificate at the time of interview/admission.
- iii. Eligibility criteria for each discipline shall be as follows.

- iv. The merit list shall be displayed at least two days before the interviews.

- v. The candidates shall appear before the admission committee in order of merit on the date and time of admission as notified/advertised.
- vi. A candidate shall lose the right of admission if they fail to appear in person along with their parent/guardian before the admission committee as per the notified date and time. However, a candidate may appeal (with proof) to the Central Admission Committee within two days in case of a genuine reason for failing to do so.
- vii. Virtual attendance shall be allowed with the prior permission of the Director of Admissions in special circumstances.
- viii. Original documents along with the admission form shall be produced at the time of interview/admission.
- ix. A candidate shall lose the right of admission if they fail to deposit admission fee on the day of interview. However, submission of the admission fee may be relaxed up to one day by the Director Admission.

Section-4: REGULATIONS FOR ADMISSION AT UNDERGRADUATE LEVEL

Admissions in the Undergraduate programmes shall be offered within three days of the declaration of results by the Board of Intermediate and Secondary Education in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa or as necessitated by the circumstances as mentioned in section 4.1(ii), after approval by the Vice Chancellor in consultation with Central Admission Committee. Admissions are open to all the eligible candidates from all over the country.

4.1 GENERAL REGULATIONS

- i. Admissions shall be granted strictly on merit determined on the basis of marks obtained in Intermediate or equivalent from a recognized board.
- ii. However in special circumstances, after approval by the Vice Chancellor in consultation with Central Admission Committee, admissions shall be granted on the basis of Intermediate Part-I result. Merit in such cases shall be determined on the marks obtained in Intermediate Part-I. Candidates, however, shall produce result of Intermediate Part-II within two weeks of the declaration of results by the BISE concerned. Moreover, the candidate shall be required to clear the Intermediate Part-II exam with the basic criteria as mentioned in Section 4.1(iv).
- iii. The Departmental Admission Committee shall determine the number of seats in each programme on the basis of the available facilities and admissions shall be made under these regulations in the consultation with the Chairperson/Head of the department concerned.

- iv. Minimum 2nd division in Intermediate or equivalent shall be required for admission in all BS programmes.
- v. The minimum number of students in each programme shall be 20.
- vi. All admissions shall be processed through the respective departmental admission committee on a merit basis. The departmental admission committee shall also scrutinize the credentials of the candidates and point out deficiencies, if any therein.
- vii. Admissions granted by the departmental admission committee shall remain provisional and shall not create any legal entitlement.
- viii. Eligibility criteria for each programme shall be as follows:

*The Board of Studies (BoS) of the teaching department shall decide whether to reserve up to 10% of the total marks obtained or 10% seats for students having passed that particular relevant subject/s as optional subject/s in intermediate examinations, in subjects offered above.

ADMISSIONS PROCEDURE

- i. A candidate seeking admission in an Undergraduate programme shall submit their registration form along with a copy of their DMC and original deposit slip or proof of payment of the admission application fee at the time of the interview.
- ii. A candidate shall also submit their two passport-size photographs with white background, a copy of their father's/guardian's CNIC, of their Provisional and Character Certificates, and of their Domicile at the time of interview/admission.
- iii. A candidate applying for admission to more than one programme shall be required to specify the choice(s) of their programme.
- iv. A candidate shall have four maximum choices of programmes on the application form.
- v. The candidate shall be allowed to transfer from one programme to another within two weeks of the commencement of the classes provided that they qualify the merit for that programme.
- vi. The provisional merit list shall be displayed two days before the final merit. Errors and omissions, if any, shall be rectified before the display of the final merit list.
- vii. The merit list shall be displayed at least two days before the interviews.
- viii. A candidate shall appear before the Admission Committee in order of merit on the date and time of admission as notified/advertised.
- x. A candidate shall lose the right of admission if they fail to appear before the Admission Committee as per the notified date and time. However, a candidate may appeal (with proof) to the Central Admission Committee within two days in case of a genuine reason for failing to do so.
- ix. Virtual attendance shall be allowed with the prior permission of the Director of Admissions in special circumstances.
- x. Original documents along with the admission form shall be presented at the time of interview/admission.
- xi. A candidate shall lose the right of admission if they fail to deposit admission fee on the day of interview. However, submission of the admission fee may be relaxed up to one day by the Director Admission.

4.2 Admission in 3rd semester of the undergraduate programme:

- i. In case of vacant seat (s), the university may advertise admissions in 3rd semester along with the 1st semester admissions in consultation with / advice of the department concerned.
- ii. Eligibility of the candidates seeking admission in 3rd semester shall be determined by the Departmental Admission Committee and Controller of Examinations or his nominee.
- iii. All those courses which are present in the relevant Scheme of Studies in ICP and have been passed by the student admitted shall be exempted. Their marks or GPA shall be transferred. Those courses which are not present in the relevant Scheme of Studies in ICP shall be counted as non-credit courses; however, these courses shall be reflected in the transcript.
- iv. The student admitted on vacant seat shall take all those courses in subsequent semesters in any class available, which are deficient in the relevant Scheme of Studies in ICP. These deficient courses shall be considered fresh not repeated.
- v. The minimum CGPA for lateral entry shall be 2.0 on the scale of 4.

4.3 Admission in 5th semester of the undergraduate programme:

- i. A student after getting associate degree may re-enter in the same programme.
- ii. Re-entry in 5th semester will depend on available seats.
- iii. In this regard, advertisement will be floated before the start of 5th semester probably in summer vacation or in the fall semester with 1st semester advertisement. The University should accommodate the re-entering along with existing 5th semester to avoid complications.
- iv. The department has the responsibility to devise a policy for admission in 5th semester for the associate degree holders. The department has the option to arrange admission/assessment test.
- v. There will be open merit among applicants for admission in 5th semester.
- vi. For that purpose, one of the following two options may be adopted:
 - a. Accepting associate transcript as it is
 - b. Offering courses in summer vacation as a bridge to complete courses as per ICP requirements
- vii. The number of major courses shall not be less than the courses in the program where the admission is sought.
- viii. In case of deficiency, additional courses will be offered.
- ix. The admission committee of the department concerned shall determine the exemption of courses or the bridging of courses.
 - x. Rejoining/merger should be allowed within two years of exit.
 - xi. Associate degree shall remain valid after joining in 5th semester.
 - xii. CGPA for re-entry should be of minimum 2.5 on the scale of 4.
- xiii. In 5th semester: Associate Degree holders/ B.A/ B.Sc passed candidates are also eligible for admission.

- xiv. Two years degree equivalent to BS shall be awarded to qualified students after completing Associate Degree. 04 years BS degree shall be awarded to students who will be enrolled in 3rd semester.

Section 5: QUOTA SEATS REGULATIONS

The following regulations shall be applicable for admission against quota seats at Intermediate and Undergraduate levels.

5.1 SPORTS QUOTA SEATS REGULATIONS

- i. Admissions against the sports quota in Intermediate shall be offered at subsidized fee.
- ii. No fee waiver shall be granted on the sports quota seats in the 1st year. Tuition fee waiver shall only be granted to students of 2nd year (3rd semester in case of BS or equivalent) who have represented Pakistan at the international level.
- iii. Sports Quota shall be clearly mentioned on the registration form with extra fee as determined by the Central Admission Committee.
- iv. All interested candidates shall appear in sports trials before the Sports Trial Committee.
- v. The trial process shall start within three days of the closing date of the submission of registration form for admission. The Director Sports shall notify the schedule of trials in the admission advertisement.
- vi. A candidate on the waiting list shall be granted admission only if a seat in the relevant quota is left unfilled or is vacated by a shortlisted candidate before the closure of the admission process.
- vii. At Intermediate level, there shall be a total of thirty seats for boys against sports quota.
- viii. Admission against sports quota shall be offered only in the games approved by BISE Peshawar for boys subject to availability of facilities in ICP.
- ix. At Intermediate level, there shall be a total of three seats for girls in Table Tennis, Badminton, and Athletics.

5.2 NEWLY MERGED DISTRICTS QUOTA SEATS REGULATIONS

- i. Admissions against the **Tribal/FR Areas Quota** Seats in Intermediate shall be offered at subsidized fee.
- ii. Admissions against the Tribal/FR Areas Quota Seats shall be offered to only those candidates who are domiciled in the Tribal district/ FR Area concerned.

- iii. The candidate's last attended school/college must be located in the territorial jurisdiction of the tribal district/FR area concerned.
- iv. The candidate shall produce their Domicile Certificate at the time of interview for admission against Tribal/ FR Areas Quota.
- v. The allocation of seats at Intermediate level shall be as follows:

5.3 **SISTER UNIVERSITY QUOTA SEATS REGULATIONS**

- i. Admissions to the Sister University Quota Seats in Intermediate shall only be offered at reciprocal rates and basis.
- ii. Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with sister university for quota seats shall be approved by the academic council and Syndicate.
- iii. Admission to sister university quota seats shall be on a merit basis amongst the candidates.

- iv. Admissions shall only be granted to the real children of the regular employees of the sister university determined on the basis of Form B/CNIC of the candidate and certificate of employment of parent duly signed by the Registrar of the concerned university.

5.4 ICP EMPLOYEES REAL CHILDREN QUOTA SEATS REGULATIONS

- i. The candidate shall produce their parent's Service Certificate duly signed by the Registrar, ICP along with their Form-B from NADRA.
- ii. The Candidate for ICP Employees' Real Children quota seats shall submit registration fees at the time of admission.
- iii. Admission shall be granted to all the eligible real children of the employees of ICP. However, no programme shall have more than five candidates from this quota.

5.5 BALUCHISTAN QUOTA SEATS REGULATIONS

- i. Admissions to the Baluchistan Quota Seats in Intermediate shall be offered at subsidized fees.
- ii. The candidate shall apply through the Director Colleges, Quetta, Baluchistan.
- iii. The Candidate's last attended school/college must be located within the territorial jurisdiction of Baluchistan.
- iv. The candidate shall produce their Domicile Certificate for admission against Baluchistan Quota Seats at the time of interview.
- v. At Intermediate level, the total number of allocated seats is five (5): Two each in Pre-Medical and Pre-Engineering; One in any other discipline.

5.6 FOREIGN STUDENTS QUOTA SEATS REGULATIONS

- i. Admissions against Foreign citizens quota seats at Intermediate shall be offered at a normal fee (Self-Finance).
- ii. The proof of foreign nationality or citizenship or residency (minimum two years) shall be mandatory
- iii. The candidate's last attended school/college must be located abroad.
- iv. An equivalence certificate from the Inter-board chairmen council (IBCC) is mandatory.
- v. Total number of allocated seats at intermediate level for boys is Two (2); one in Pre-Medical and one in other discipline.
- vi. Total number of allocated seats at intermediate level for girls is Two (2): One in Pre-Medical and one in any other discipline.

5.7 AFGHAN STUDENTS QUOTA SEATS REGULATIONS

- i. The candidate shall produce a valid passport, Visa, and No Objection Certificate (NoC) or Refugee Registration from NADRA from the Embassy or Consulate of Afghanistan at the time of admission/ interview.
- ii. Admission in intermediate to Afghan students shall be offered at a subsidized fee (Open).
- iii. Total number of allocated seats at intermediate level is Ten (10): as per following distribution:

- i. Admissions to (ICS) Quota in intermediate shall be offered at subsidized fee (open).
- ii. Admissions to (ICS) quota seats shall be on a merit basis amongst the ICS students.
- iii. Total number of allocated seats is fifteen (15): Six (6) seats each in Pre-Medical and Pre-Engineering while three (03) seats shall be allocated in any other disciplines.

5.9 ALUMNI CHILDREN QUOTA SEATS

- i. Admissions against Alumni Children Quota Seats at Intermediate shall be offered at normal (self finance fee).
- ii. The candidate shall submit their parent's certificate or degree by virtue of which the parent claims to be the alumni of Islamia College Peshawar.
- iii. Admission against Alumni Children Quota Seats shall be on the merit among the Alumni's children.
- iv. The total number of seats allocated in this quota shall be three (03) at Intermediate level.

5.10 QUOTA SEATS for O-LEVEL

- i. Admissions against O-level quota seats shall be offered at normal fees (Self-Finance) at Intermediate level.
- ii. An equivalence certificate from the Inter-Boards Chairmen Council (IBCC) shall be produced at the time of interview.

- iii. The total number of allocated seats in this quota shall be ten (10); out of which, six (6) shall be reserved for boys and four (4) for girls.
