EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Islamia College Peshawar was founded in 1913, having been upgraded in 2008 as a public sector university and since then, over a period of 15 years, Islamia College Peshawar has excelled in the field of academics and research at national and international level. Acclaimed nationally and internationally, Islamia College Peshawar provides quality education in the fields ranging from traditional subjects like Pushto, Urdu and Islamic Studies to advanced subjects like Computer Science, Software Engineering and Genetics. The present report highlights the achievements of the University in the academics and research, governance & administration, linkages with industry, access to education, quality assurance, strengthening infrastructure and finances during the year 2024-25.

With emphasis on strengthening research and university-academia linkages, MOUs have been signed with several national and international universities. Keeping in view the importance of research, our faculty has published 597 research papers have been published, which helped the University progress in its rankings while many research projects have been won by the faculty, which are listed down in the relevant sections of this Annual Report. The University has been strictly adhering to the quality assurance guidelines based on HEC's QAA revamped Framework PSG 2023 in formulating academic procedures along with academic designs, teaching and learning, student engagement, assessment, external examination and research. In the current year, the University Conducted S-RIPE HEC consisting of two external and four internal members. The team held it's meetings with HODs, Sectional Heads, students, faculty-members, administrative officers & support staff. The S-RIPE team discussed its observations & recommendations with the Vice Chancellor in it's exit meeting. Detailed report of the team is awaited.

The University is striving hard to get global recognition in the field of higher education and making its place as a ranked University in the coming years under the leadership of Honourable Vice-Chancellor Prof. Dr. Ahmad Ur Rehman Saljoqi. Under his able leadership, the ICP shall strive to improve its standing in the areas of research , finance and infrastructure.

In line with our exercise conducted last year as per HEC directives, an MS/M.Phil & Ph.D Program Review (Self) was successfully conducted by the Program Review Panel consisting of internal members. who are well-versed in matters related to Quality Assurance. The University has been collaborating with both local and international universities and various other organizations in order to expand the scope of research produced by Islamia College Peshawar and to start exchange programs. By focusing on increasing international linkages, foreign collaboration and global image, Islamia College Peshawar has signed several MoUs with foreign universities.

The University has been awarded a research project by the provincial government for establishment of center for material sciences, with an approved cost of Rs. 379.788 million. The provincial cabinet has approved the grant-in-aid for the project to complete the procurement of high quality equipment which will enhance the capability of the university in facilitating the research scholars. Different tests conducted by the center will generate revenue of more than Rs. 30 million per year once the equipment is functionalized.



HISTORICAL BACKGROUND

Islamia College Peshawar, a symbol of academic excellence in the region, is a unique, magnificent and architectural facade, lush green lawns and gorgeous buildings attract tourists from all over the country and abroad. It not only reflects a beautiful nexus of Aligarh and Deoband Schools of Thoughts in accordance with modern developments. Being the breeding ground of young professionals of the region, this great seat of learning is a good heaven where diamonds are skimmed since 1913. Moreover, Islamia College Peshawar is destined as the mother of all the institutions of modern education in the Northern Pakistan. Its credit goes to Sir Sahibzada Abdul Qaiyum, the Sir Sayyed of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, and his sincere colleagues who started Islamia College Peshawar in 1913.

Islamia College Peshawar is the promising child of endowments. The University spreads over a land of 300 acres; it has 545-acre cultivable land in Harichand, Rai Killi and Tarnab, District Charsadda. The University owns 395 shops and flats in the Khyber Bazaar, Peshawar and in the main bazaar Charsadda. Its property also includes 4000 Kanals of land at Hund in Swabi District.

The University has got a proud privilege of being visited by the father of the nation Quaid-e-Azam Muhammad Ali Jinnah, in 1936, 1945 and 1948. Quaid-e-Azam became the lifelong honorary member of the Khyber Union ICP in 1936 and made the College one of the heirs of his property in 1939. The Quaid Trust, later on, paid an amount of Rs. 10,811,600/- in different installments to the college.

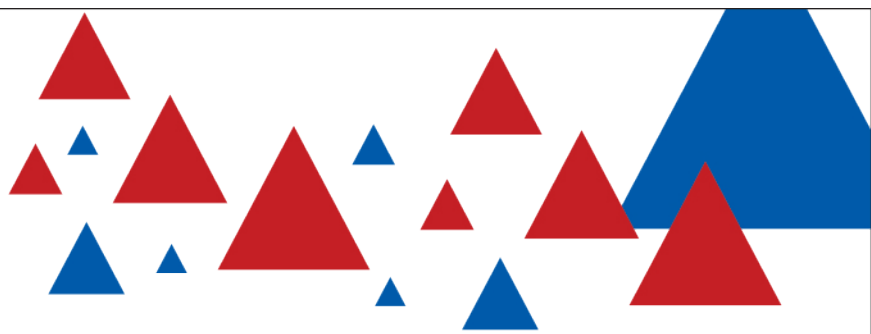

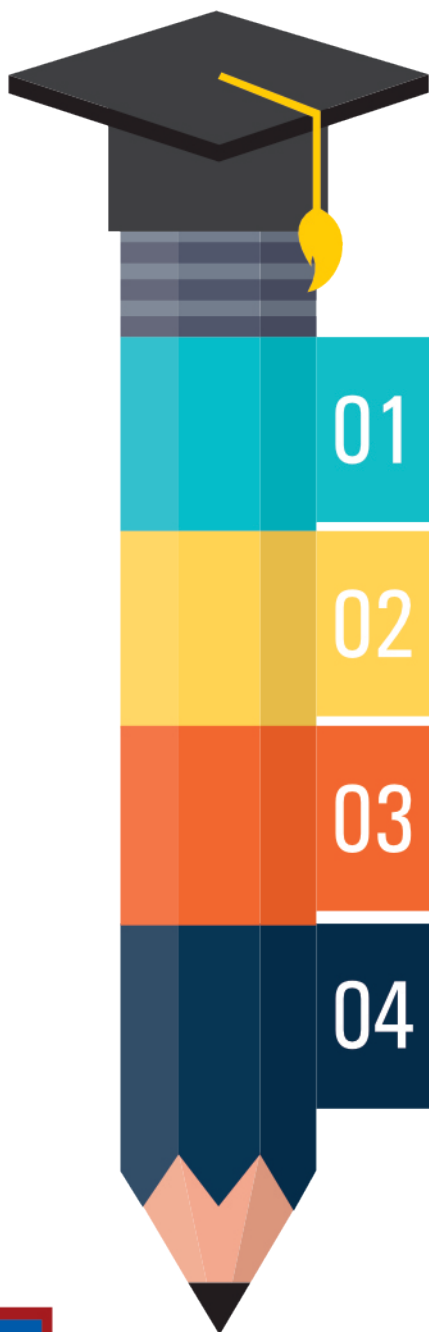

During the session 2024-25, total number of students enrolled at University-level was 14650.

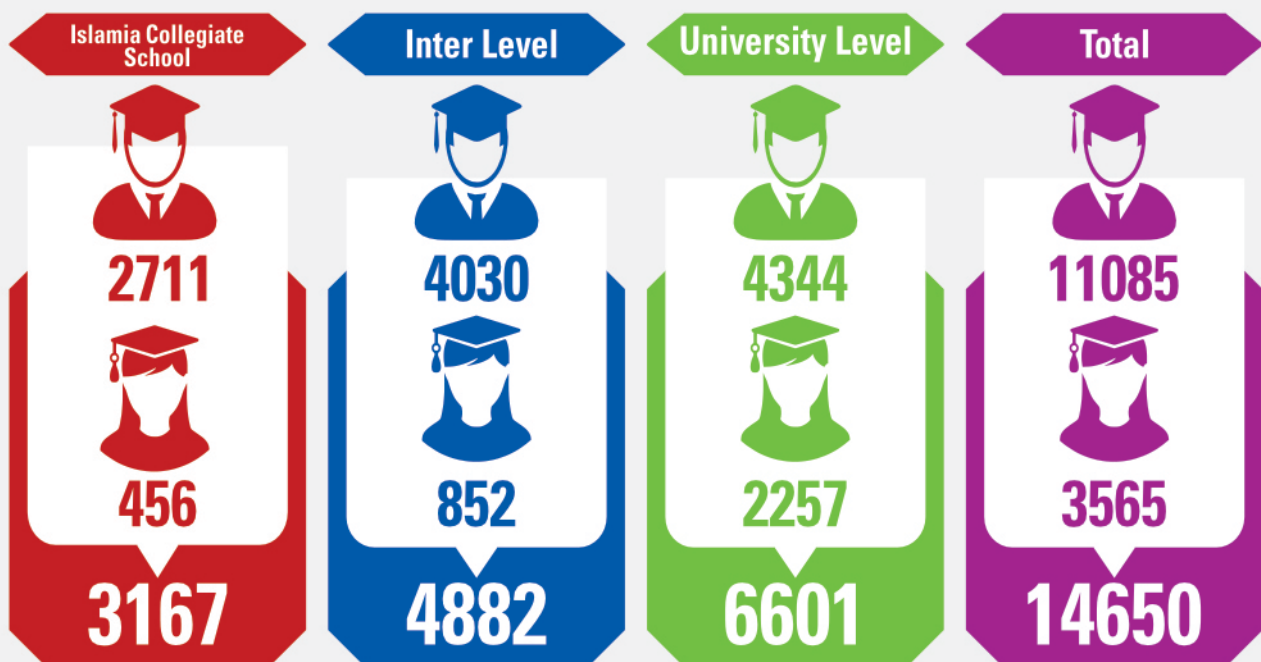

QUALITY ASSURANCE:

Quality Assurance and Functioning of QEC:

In order to improve the quality of education, the Quality Enhancement Cell (QEC) at Islamia College Peshawar is working in accordance with the guidelines of HEC. The QEC was able to achieve most of its targets. The following activities were undertaken during the year 2024-25:

i. Progress against Review of Institutional Performance & Enhancement

- . IPR for the year 2024-25 was prepared.
- . The QEC coordinated with all departments/sectional for the S-RIPE of the University and all preparations were made to make the most important review a success.
- . RIPE of the University was conducted on July 16-18, 2025 by the QEC through a panel having two external experts.

ii. Progress against Compliance Implementation Plan (CIP) of IPE 2022-23 & 2023-24

- . The status of corrective actions taken so far on implementation plan of Self-IPE 2023-24 were reviewed through a committee.

iii. Progress against Graduate Program Review

- . Graduate Program Review (Self) was conducted by the University through a Self-Program Review comprising of two external members.
- . An implementation plan was prepared on the recommendations of the Program Review Committee (Self) and circulated to all offices concerned.
- . Follow-up on the action plan is in process.

iv. Progress against Compliance Implementation Plan (CIP) of Program Review 2023-24

- . Corrective measures of the program review for the years 2023-24 were reviewed through a committee.
- . The committee checked the status of corrective actions taken so far on the Program Review (Self) for the year 2023-24 before the Graduate Program Review for year 2024-25.

v. Progress against Program Self-Assessment

The QEC initiated the process of conducting self-assessment through PREE as per the newly launched PSG-2023, quality assurance framework. The Program Teams (PT) for all the running programs (61 programs) have already been reconstituted and notified by the office of Registrar. The Teacher & Course Evaluation by the Student was conducted for the first time through CMS to introduce the Teacher Evaluation process through Campus Management System (CMS). An orientation session was arranged for all the students on 13.03.2025. Afterwards, the surveys were floated through CMS for all the departments. A large number of students and faculty members from various departments participated in the session. Prof. Dr. Izhar Ahmad, Director QEC appreciated the enthusiastic participation and briefed the students on the role of QEC in ensuring academic quality and the importance of teacher evaluation. Director IT provided an overview of the CMS, an advanced integrated system that enables students to perform various functions and tasks online.

b. Faculty Pursuing Higher Studies

Currently, more than 20 faculty-members are enrolled for MPhil/PhD at different universities and expected to complete their degrees in the next few years. Previously, Islamia College Peshawar sent 17 scholars abroad for PhD studies with the support of HEC under Faculty Development Program. iv. Students Enrollment and Degrees Awarded Annually

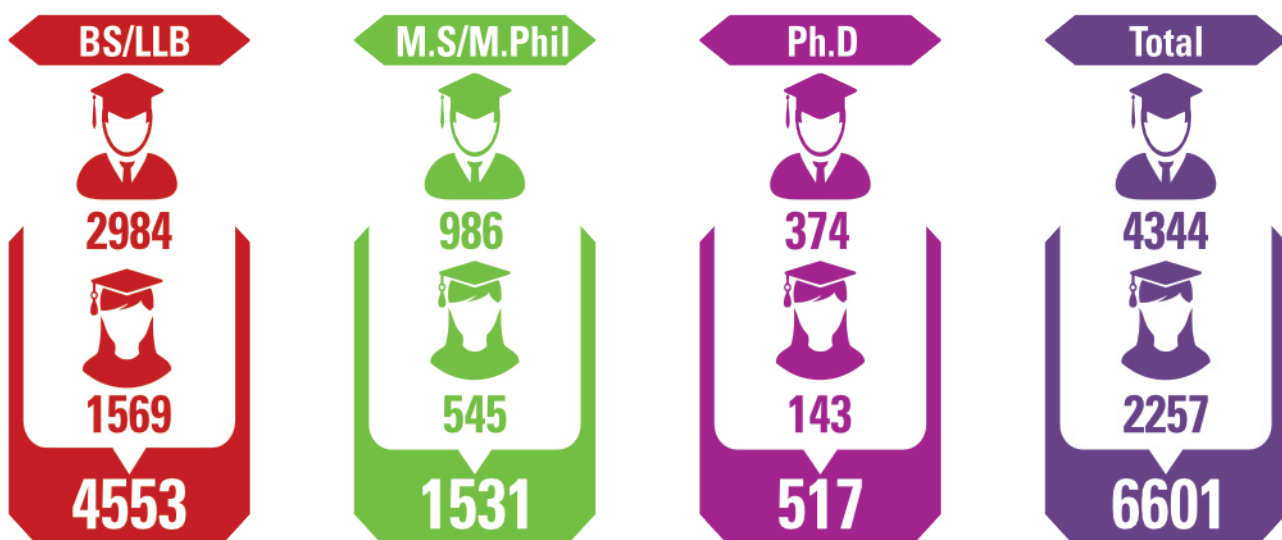

a. Student Population

- During the session 2024-25, the total number of students enrolled was 14650; of these, 6601 students were enrolled in different disciplines at the university level; 4882 students in intermediate in the constituent colleges; and 3167 students in Islamia Collegiate School, the constituent school of the university.
- As regards the university students, 4553 at BS level and 1531 scholars were enrolled in the MS/MPhil program and 517 scholars in the PhD program.

At Islamia College Peshawar, there are 4553 students at BS-Level in five faculties of which 65.5% are Male and 34.5% are Female, at MS/M.Phil level 64.5% are Male and 35.5% are Female and at PhD level, the ratio of male to female students is 72.3% to 27.6%. Within the meager resources of the University, this ratio of female students is quite encouraging. Table below shows students' enrollment at each level at the University and over the campus:

Research & Development

Research is an integral part of the University activities and one of the main objectives of the research activities at the University is to provide useful and cost effective solution to the problem faced by the community. Therefore, Islamia College Peshawar gives great importance to research activities. The University is also planning to allocate budget from its resources to establish Research Endowment Fund to fund students' projects for BS/MPhil/PhD level.

i. Research & Development

Research & Development is an important component of any university. Universities all around the world are known by their Research Output. R&D activity consists of two major sub categories: Research Project (funded and non-funded) and Publications. Faculty at Islamia College Peshawar is actively involved in R&D activities and produced outstanding performance under various categories.

The research and development activities undertaken by the University during the year 2024-25 included submission of research project for research grants, workshops and trainings and research papers published. We are looking forward to working with the industry to commercialize the research conducted by our post graduate students under the guidance of the faculty members.

LIST OF FUNDED RESEARCH PROJECTS

Many funding agencies announce 'Call for Proposals' soliciting ideas from researchers to be funded, which are shared with the faculty-members. Many faculty-members submit their proposals which are scrutinized by the funding agencies and later on, successful projects are awarded. During the reporting year, more than 20 projects have been submitted to different funding agencies.

Another major project funded by Government of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa titled "Establishment of Research Center for Material Science" is also in advanced stages. Total cost of the project approved in 2017 was Rs. 221.984-million and was revised in 2022 to 379.788 -million. Procurement of equipment is expected to start soon.

It is hoped that with the establishment of the Center for Material Sciences, which is being established as a Research Center, MPhil and PhD degree will be offered in Material Physics/ Sciences. Besides that, it will provide an opportunity to the students of M. Phil/ PhD in Physics, Chemistry, Zoology, Botany, etc to perform different types of experiments. Moreover, the Center will help in provision of trained human resource for industries and generate revenues for the University. The center will also be able to perform these tests on commercial basis for construction and other firms for which currently the wait time is in months. CMS will help the mineral industry in the raw-material analysis for identification of the minerals.

Following programs will be offered in the CMS:

1. PhD
2. MPhil
3. Industrial Diploma

Following tests will be performed in the Center:

1. Ball milling, Grinding, Polishing & Pellet Press
2. Drying Oven, Furnaces
3. XRD and XRF Tests
4. LCR Meter with TCF, Ferroelectric test system & Piezoelectric test
5. Scanning Electron Microscope EDS with FESEM
6. Universal testing machine, Thermal Conductivity, FTIR, TGA/DTA & DSC.

By providing the lab facilities to other universities and industries, estimated revenue will be around Rs. 35 to 40 million per annum, once the center is fully functional. This do not include the fee received from MPhil/ PhD students.

Islamia College Peshawar was established through Islamia College Peshawar Act 2009 which was repealed in 2012 and replaced by Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Universities Act 2012 (amended till date) and functions under Islamia College Statutes, 2016. i. UNIVERSITY GOVERNANCE

Islamia College Peshawar follows Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Universities Act 2012 (amended till date) and Islamia College Peshawar Statutes 2016 for all matters related to its governance and operations. ii. STRENGTHENING PHYSICAL INFRASTRUCTURE

Following projects have been undertaken to expand the existing buildings of the college and create pace for new disciplines/offices, with updated status given at the end of each project:

Project Titled "IT Industrial Innovation, Research Center and Strengthening of Islamia College University, Peshawar"

The Project "IT Industrial Innovation, Research Center and Strengthening of Islamia College University, Peshawar" was approved by CDWP on February 07, 2017 at a Capital Cost of Rs.1385.985 Million. The administrative approval was issued on April 05, 2017 for a period of 48 Months.

The Revised PC1 of the Project titled "IT Industrial Innovation, Research Center and Strengthening of Islamia College University, Peshawar" was submitted on August 6, 2024. First review meeting was held on Thursday, September 05, 2024, 10:30 AM at Mural Hall, HEC, Islamabad and consequently Revised PC-1 was submitted to Planning Commission of Pakistan after a series of changes. Pre-CDWP meeting was held on 21st February, 2025 and finally revised PC-1 was approved by CDWP on 15-05-2025 at a Capital Cost of Rs. 2454.531 million with an implementation period of up to 30-06-2026. Project has been awarded to M/S FWO after competitive bidding with a rebate of Rs. 277 million.

iii. STRENGTHENING TECHNOLOGICAL INFRASTRUCTURE

In line with the national vision for e-governance and digital transformation, Islamia College Peshawar has taken significant steps toward modernizing its technological infrastructure. These developments are aimed at improving academic administration, enhancing operational transparency, and delivering efficient digital services to students and staff alike.

1. Learning and Campus Management System (LMS/CMS)

To digitize the student and employee life cycle, Islamia College Peshawar received a special grant from the Higher Education Commission (HEC) for developing a Learning Management System (LMS) on 17th May 2021. Additionally, under the World Bank-financed "Higher Education Development in Pakistan (HEDP)" project, the College was awarded Rs. 27.358 million on 28th May 2021 to strengthen financial autonomy and governance through the use of technology.

A dedicated LMS/CMS Committee was reconstituted on 29th June 2021 to develop a Request for Proposal (RFP), incorporating feedback from stakeholders and aligned with best practices from Hazara University. The Syndicate approved the ERP/CMS acquisition in its 27th meeting on 11th September 2021, following a recommendation from the Academic Council (23rd August 2021).

2. Infrastructure Enhancement for CMS/ERP

2. Infrastructure Enhancement for CMS/ERP

. ICT equipment, including HCI servers, data storage, and firewalls, were procured through a tender awarded to M/s Gerry's Information Technology (Pvt.) Ltd. on 3rd August 2023.

. A 10-KW solar system was installed through a competitive procurement process on 28th February 2023, ensuring 24/7 uninterrupted power supply to data centers hosting the CMS/ERP infrastructure.

3. Admission and Academic Module Integration

Admissions for Intermediate Session 2023 and 2024 were successfully conducted through the CMS/ERP. The system also manages:

- . Student records and academic results
- . Payroll and financial accounts
- . Scholarships, hostel, transport, and student affairs
- . Academic schedules, attendance, and course planning
- . Administrative project and document management

These modules have optimized resource allocation, improved transparency, and streamlined operations.

4. Digital Banking Integration

To facilitate digital payments and enhance convenience:

- . The Bank of Khyber branch was established on campus following Syndicate approval in its 28th meeting held on 18th December 2021.
- . ICP is now working with Bank of Khyber to integrate CMS/ ERP for Internet Banking providing ease of access for students and parents.

5. E-Office System Implementation

The E-Office system represents a transformative shift from traditional paperwork to a secure and efficient digital file and communication management platform. It was formally inaugurated by Mr. Meena Khan, Honourable Pro-Chancellor/Minister for Higher Education on the eve of 9th Convocation on 10th May, 2025.

The system has been successfully implemented at Islamia College Peshawar in March 2025. It enables electronic handling of official tasks, promoting secure, transparent, and trackable workflows across all departments.

Faculty members of Islamia College Peshawar are involved in Research Activities and often get chance to visit other countries to participate in conferences and present papers. In this connection, faculty-members of Islamia College Peshawar endeavor to obtain fellowships and post-doctoral slots in order to enhance their knowledge and keep themselves updated in line with the current market trends. Some faculty-members have been awarded travel grants to attend conferences abroad able to obtain Post-Doctoral Fellowship(s) at renowned universities around the world, out of which a few are funded by Higher Education Commission selected after a rigorous, competitive process. FINANCE

During the last few years, the rising cost of fuel as well as increase in the salaries coupled with decrease in the allocation of Budget to the HEC has brought the Higher Education sector under financial stress. Academic activities have been barely made possible. However, Research expenditure has come to an all-time low. In this situation, financial sustainability has been one of the challenges faced by Universities. On one hand, the Public Sector Universities want to avoid burdening the students while on the other side, they have to focus on fund-generation to gradually decrease the reliance on public funding. During the last few years, the focus has been on financial discipline at ICP. Brief overview of the receipts and expenditure during the year 2024-25 are given below:

i. BUDGET

During the year 2023-24, the University has been able to generate around Rs. 1334.538 million from its own resources. A total of Rs. 476.728 million has been received from HEC during the year 2023-24. Expenses incurred were Rs.1855.240 million, thus giving a net surplus of Rs. 10.574-million.

During the year 2024-25, the University has been able to generate around Rs. 1713.566 million from its own resources. A total of Rs. 435.934 million has been received from HEC during the year 2024-25. Expenses incurred were Rs.2160.074 million.

ii. FUNDS GENERATION/DEVELOPMENT

During the year 2023-24, the University was able to generate own resources of Rs. 1334.538-million as compared to Rs. 968.757-million of last year (2022-23). This was possible due to proactive strategy by the University to recover outstanding dues from the students and increase revenue. For the Financial Year, 2025-26, we plan to increase our receipts through various measures including 30% increase in the number of students at Inter-level, Introduction of few new disciplines at BS level including BS Biology, BS MLT, BS Data Science, BS HPE & few other disciplines.





We are extremely grateful to Government of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa for providing an amount of Rs. 150-million as Grant-in-Aid for Islamia College Peshawar.

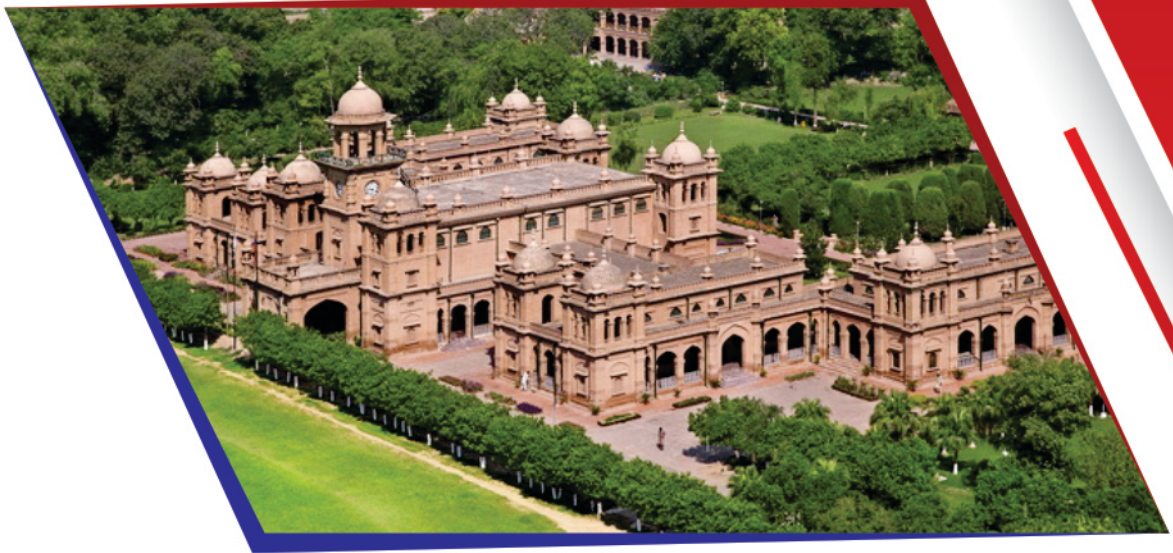
